Dr. Edgar Epperly has been researching the Villisca Axe Murder mystery for over 60 years. He has written dozens of true crime articles, scholarly papers and blog posts, and has appeared on dozens of television and radio programs, podcasts, symposiums and at film festivals.

He is a popular guest speaker at colleges, universities, historical societies, museums, libraries, and bookstores. He was interviewed and served as the key consultant on the award-winning documentary feature film VILLISCA: LIVING WITH A MYSTERY produced by Emmy-nominated Fourth Wall Films. He is the subject of the award-winning documentary short AXMAN. He resides in Decorah, lowa with his wife, Joyce.

When checked out, community members can add to the journal however they see fit as long as it fits within a few rules and guidelines which are included with every journal.

There are 20 community journals in total with each journal having its own theme. Contributors are encouraged to interpret that theme however they would like. However, there are three journals in particular that are sketching or drawing focused where contributors are encouraged to sketch or draw their submission according to the theme.

To mark the addition of these community journals to the Gibson Memorial Library, an open house will be held on Friday, April 15th from 4:30 PM - 5:30 PM. The community journals will be available for checkout for the first time at the beginning of the open house and suggestions for possible future journals will be accepted. Jordan Foote, the library's programming specialist, will be on hand to answer any specific questions patrons may have about the community journals and the process.
